



Professors will facilitate the discussion, monitor the online forum and provide feedback on the performance of each student. Contributions will count as class participation. 				

EXAMINATIONS:

5 Project Study Papers (PSP)

= A Project Study Paper comprises approx. 15 pages and contains project-based application of knowledge. Written elaboration of the PSP and participation on the learning platform (so-called student engagement) are evaluated as proof of performance. The written part of a PSP is worth 70% of the overall grade of the project study paper combined with the student's engagement which counts for 30%.

9 Transfer Documentation Reports (TDR)

= A Transfer Documentation Report comprises approx. 20 pages and is an application-based paper. Written elaboration of the PSP and participation on the learning platform (so-called student engagement) are evaluated as proof of performance. The written part of a PSP is worth 70% of the overall grade of the project study paper combined with the student's engagement which counts for 30%.

4 Transfer Papers (TP)

= A Transfer Paper comprises approx. 5 pages. Written elaboration of the TA and participation on the learning platform (so-called student engagement) are evaluated as proof of performance. The written part of a TP is worth 70% of the overall grade of the transfer paper combined with the student's engagement which counts for 30%.

1 Master Thesis (MT)

= A Master's Thesis comprises 80-100 pages and contains project-based application and critical reflection of the application phase.
